PREVENTION Why we should act immediately?




Children with disabilities are up to four times more likely to face abuse.

Women with disabilities are nearly 40% more likely to face abuse in adulthood.



A mere 3% of sexual abuses involving people with developmental disabilities are ever reported.







In the U.S., people with intellectual disabilities experience **SEVEN TIMES MORE SEXUAL VIOLENCE** than people without disabilities. It is a crime that often goes unreported and goes unpunished.

Vulnerability of children with disabilities

What about a child who does not speak? Does not see? Does not hear? Depends on other people to go to the bathroom? Cannot defend herself?

Why does this happen?



Children with disabilities are considered more vulnerable to abuse due to greater physical and social isolation

- Insensitive and/or intrusive medical interventions
- Greater dependency on others and diminished control over their life and decision making
- Lack of communication and language

Why does this happen?



- People with disabilities need to trust other people and are taught to be nice to others
- People with disabilities are not taught to defend themselves against violence
- There are ALMOST NO materials for prevention and professional training, AND VERY LITTLE discussion on the subject.



How to talk about it?







Families are convinced that things like this will never happen to their daughters and sons.



- BUT...

Pretending that
violence does not exist

- Failing to warn about the dangers of life

Make children more vulnerable than they already are.



Strengthen children with information to prevent violence



Aim: homes, schools, clinics, churches, (90% pwd are in inclusive schools in Brazil)

Strategy: Listen to and understand parents and teachers

- Find ways to talk about it without offending or embarrassing
- Teach in a way that all children, with and without disabilities, learn together



Change the narrative:

Sex education



Education to prevent violence



Why is this diferent?

- Easy to understand communication



- Direct information, no metaphors
- Self-explanatory illustrations, concrete situations



- Dressed characters, diversity, images do not offend, provoke shame or embarrassment
- Focus on protecting the body FROM BULLYING TO ABUSE AND PHYSICAL VIOLENCE

VALIDATION WITH FOCUS AUDIENCE



Mascot - a black girl with disability



Her mother knew she was more vulnerable to violence. Her mother created an easy to understand book for her.


Now she knows how to prevent violence and wants to tell about it to other children Cotinha (Little Cot, from mascot)



Things that all children with and without disabilities have to know from a young age:

1 – Know the NAME of all parts of the body, including their PRIVATE PARTS





2 - Like and be PROUD of their own body





3 – Know that they OWN THEIR BODIES





4 - Know that people they TRUST can HELP with showering, using the bathroom





5 - Know that the DOCTOR or NURSE can touch them when they are sick





- Know that it is WRONG for anyone to TOUCH THEIR PRIVATE PARTS






7 - Know that it is WRONG for anyone to hit them





8 – Know how to RESPECT OTHER people's bodies





9 – Know how to recognize DANGEROUS situations





10 - Know WHAT TO DO, in case of any violence: Shout, say no, get out, ask for help






11 - Know WHAT TO DO, in case of any violence: DO "NO SIGN" with the head, make a STOP sign with hand





12 – Know that they should TELL a trusted person what happened, UNTIL THEY FIND PROTECTION







13 – Learn to NOT KEEP SECRET of what is WRONG





14 – Know that IT'S NOT THEIR FAULT





15 – Know that they should stay AWAY from the person who does harm

- Deaf girl, 9 years old
- Wealthy family would "raise her"
- Was given to the daughter when she got married, and left the city
- Birth mother never stopped trying to find her
- Sonia worked as a maid for 40 Years with no salary
- No school, no sign language, no health or dental services
- She was rescued from slave-like conditions in the house of a magistrate in the Court of Justice of Santa Catarina
- Sonia's sisters wanted to visit her and take her home
- The magistrate's family convinced Sonia to return to the house from where she had been rescued.




